A. Washington D.C Update

John Morales reported:

- Patricia Ray and John Morales attended the National Association of Workforce Boards Conference in Washington, DC on March 28 through March 31, 2015.
- Tom Perez, Secretary of Labor presented at the conference. He informed the audience that the regulation will be out soon.
- A staff member for Senator Patty Murray, Scott Chaney, indicated that the WIOA Act has enough flexibility that every demand should be met.

B. State Update

John Morales reported:

- Local areas continue to work on different Task Forces with the State
- The state allowed each local area to submit the Local Area Designation Letter for approval with the approval of each area's Local Elected Officials.

C. Update on Board of Supervisors Meeting

- A presentation on the Introduction of WIOA was presented to the Yuma County Board of Supervisors on Monday, April 6, 2015
- The Local Area Designation Letter was approved by the Board of Supervisors on Monday, April 6, 2015.
- John Morales asked the board members to thank the members of the Board of supervisors for approving the Local Area Designation Letter and for having confidence on the WIB Board.

D. IBEST Project

Carrie Zaragoza from Adult Literacy Plus of Southwest Arizona and Kelly Crawford from AZ Dept. of Education reported:

- Integrated Basic Education and Skills training (I-BEST) is a
 nationwide model developed to provide basic literacy
 education as well as post-secondary skills in a contextualized
 and collaborative learning environment to allow students to
 quickly move from being basic skills deficient into the
 workforce and livable wage jobs.
- Arizona I-BEST takes this model one step further by incorporating the partnership with the Arizona Workforce Connection to target individuals whose low literacy skills prevents them from participating in post-secondary training for which they would otherwise qualify for.
- This model allows for success among all partners and most importantly, improves the lives of the participants by giving them the education needed for unsubsidized employment.
- Arizona Department of Education had a competitive grant solicitation last fall that all 25 grant funded programs could apply for.
- ALPS applied for the AZ I-BEST grant and was awarded the grant to work in partnership with YPIC and AWC for their Certified Nursing Assistant program.
- The I-BEST Model is to have 2 teachers in the classroom coteaching at all times, the ABE Instructor (ALPS) and the College Professor (AWC).
- They are currently working to create this model and the first step toward this goal is the GED and I-BEST Academy. Once this is completed, students will transition to the CNA Course with a clear advantage over the other students.

- John Morales recognized Mia Armenta from the Somerton District for working with low income participants.
- Carrie Zaragoza has been recommended by the Arizona Department of Education to serve as part of the WIB board.

- Patrick Goetz from YPIC presented a power point on Rapid Response and Business Services.
- Patrick Goetz explained that the Sea Food companies offer seasonal employment for 3 to 4 months.
