Question	Response
Aside from the pre-test are there any other enrollment requirements?	Applicants are prepared for what to expect and general enrollment action items that need to be completed.
What is the feedback from employers, with being able to hire graduates immediately?	MCCCD engages with 18 industry advisors and host hiring events. Upcoming Chandler hiring event with 150 Graduates with industry engagement panel.
Do you recruit at the high school level?	Developing a long-term plan, while 17-year-olds can take the course, there is an 18-year-old requirement for the positions. Outreach is necessary at the high school level.

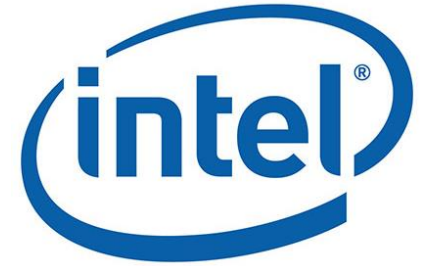

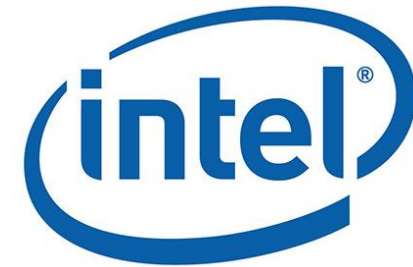
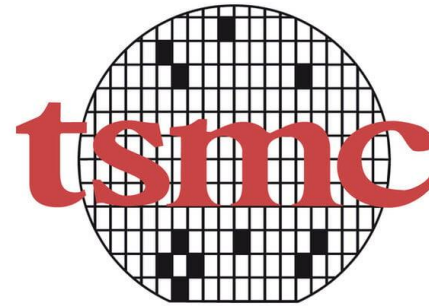
