4. Board Platform Vendor and Scope of Work:

PBWD Board Liaison, Genie Usher, invited ELC members to volunteer to assist with the compilation of the Board platform software solicitation Scope of Work. The City of Phoenix, Community and Economic Development Department currently has a contract with Govenda that is set to expire in January of 2023. Genie explained to the members the purpose of putting out a new solicitation. ELC Vice Chair Nick Bielinski, Steven Cramer and Daniel Barajas volunteered to spend 30 minutes assisting Genie with the Scope of Work.

5. November Full Meeting Location Option/Discussion (Veterans Week):

ELC Vice Chair Nick Bielinski discussed having future ELC meetings inperson once or twice per year. In particular the November 10 Full Board meeting falls the day before Veteran's Day and PBWDB member, Patrick Fitzhugh had previously volunteered to host this meeting at the USAA campus in Phoenix. Nick explained that these meetings would still offer a hybrid option and in-person attendance would not be mandatory. PBWDB Executive Director, LaSetta Hogans made note that these meetings will still be required to have a virtual attendance option, per City Standard. Nick suggested that the Board also extend this meeting invitation to Mayor Gallego. ELC member Daniel Barajas expressed agreement with this

suggestion. It was discussed that a list of attendees needed to be provided to Patrick Fitzhugh

6. Committee Updates:

Business and Workforce Engagement Committee (BWEC):

Jesus Love, BWEC Chair, shared the committee will continue to work on the strategies with regularly scheduled workgroup meetings for each of the strategies. He also discussed a future coalition of community colleges and a finished workforce alliance to possibly do a joint event. He indicated that there will be more to come on that because he had not heard back from them.

Program Excellence Committee (PEC):

Daniel Barajas, PEC Chair, shared that the committee had a new board member join the Committee. The Committee has been more intentional and purposeful with their scorecard and is working on strategies to improve it by subdividing members to each one of the strategy areas and working towards refining the metrics and the timelines. The committee has also included success stories of the workforce program participants as a standing agenda item.

<u>Additional Updates:</u> Steven Cramer, ELC Member, provided an update on behalf of the Branding and Engagement Strategy Team (BEST) work group, which reflects the team's initiative to be able to focus on the data and the communications that relates to the data to ARIZONA@WORK. Steven gave an overview of the One Stop Operator Monthly report to the ELC.











Top contributors : Category - Q1




Top contributors : Sub sub Category – Q1






Top contributors : Category – Q2











Top contributors : Category - Q3, Q4




Pageview Vs Unique pageview

- ✓ Page view the first page a visitor goes to on your site, essentially their point of arrival. They might get there from clicking a Google search result, following a link in an email, or following a recommendation from another site.
- ✓ Unique Page view -The total number of times a page was viewed by users in a single session. In other words, a unique pageview aggregates pageviews that are generated by the same user during a session. So, if a person viewed the same page twice (or more times) during an individual session, unique pageviews would only count that pageview once.
- ✓ Periodical steady increment is observed over 2022 Q3






Entrances



- Entry Page The first page viewed by a visitor while browsing through a website.
- Visible increment of entrances for June 2022




Avg. Time on Page



The average amount of time spent on a single page by all users of a website. This
metric does not consider exit pages or bounces, and only measures the average time
spent by users on non-exit pages



Bounce rate



- The percentage of visitors that leave your website after viewing a single page.
- No further increment is observed in 2022
