4. For Information and Discussion: Arizona Center for Youth Resources (ACYR)

Arizona Center for Youth Resources (ACYR) provider Shayne Abrahams presented on the Justice involved Youth services. This program engages young adults in a three-phase career development process that includes self-exploration where youth identify their personal strengths, skills, values, and interests using validated career assessments. Career exploration youth learn about specific career pathways through employer guest speakers, informational interviews, workplace visits, and job shadowing. During the career planning and management phase of the program the youth begin setting and achieving education and training goals that align with personal career interests and identified career pathways.

5. For Information and Discussion: Opportunities for Youth (OFY)

Kristin Ferguson-Colvin, director of the ASU Center for Human Capital and Youth Development, along with Elizabeth Hatch Mody, research specialist, presented on career and educational opportunities for refugee youth. In 2017 total refugee arrivals was 2,289 and more than half of all refugees are children and youth. Arizona is one of the top 10 states for resettlement. OFY will identify 50 youth ages 16-24, both opportunity youth and in- school working youth. A one-page survey with demographics in five focus areas will be presented to the youth. Jeff Kulaga Committee Chair extended an invite to OFY to come back in June to review the final report of the study.
