Randy Gibb is Dean of the Colangelo College of Business at Grand Canyon University (GCU), Phoenix, AZ. Under his leadership since 2014, the business college has moved forward with the vision of *Inspiring Free Markets and Purpose for Prosperity* and *Business as a Force for Good*. He is responsible for all strategic, operational, and accreditation aspects of the GCU’s business college’s 32 academic programs. Prior to taking over the business school at GCU, Randy was an Associate Professor and Chair, Human and Environmental Systems at the College of Technology and Innovation, Arizona State University, as well as a Director Educational Consultant at Apollo Group. He retired as a Full Colonel from the US Air Force in 2012 as Command Pilot having flown 6 different aircraft. Originally from Stevens Point, WI, he and his family lived in many states while serving in the Air Force, AZ, TX, DE, RI, CO, and OH.

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

Starting his flying career at Williams AFB, AZ, he was a T-38 Instructor/Evaluator Pilot followed by an assignment to Dover AFB, DE as a C-5 Instructor/Evaluator Pilot. Randy commanded two flying units, a C-21 VIP flying unit at Peterson AFB, CO and the 99th Flying Training Squadron, T-1 aircraft at Randolph AFB, TX. He served two assignments at the US Air Force Academy, CO, once as an instructor, leading the Human Factors Division and a second time as Deputy Chair and then Chair of the Behavioral Sciences and Leadership Department. While at the Academy, he also served as an assistant coach of the intercollegiate boxing team. Randy finished his Air Force career at Wright-Patterson AFB, OH, as a Senior Military Professor, Human Systems Integration, Air Force Institute of Technology, the Air Force’s research and graduate school. Randy has published one book as lead author on aviation visual perception, five peer-reviewed scholarly articles, eight non-scholarly publications, and nine research presentations.

EDUCATION AND AWARDS

Randy was a Distinguished Graduate from the US Air Force Academy in 1986, the Outstanding Graduate in Behavioral Sciences and Leadership. He was team captain of the 1986 National Collegiate Boxing Association championship team and was an individual national champion at 147 lbs. He earned his PhD and Master of Science in Engineering from Arizona State University in Industrial Engineering – Human Factors. He also has a Master of Arts from the US Naval Command & Staff College in Newport, RI.
