### VI. Director's Report and Information Items

### A. Washington update

John Morales reported:

- Last year the SKILLS Act was passed by the House, but did not pass the Senate.
- Vice President Biden asked by President Obama to chair a committee to review Workforce Programs, but it was not well received by Congress
- There is a slight possibility of a bipartisan bill to be passed maybe next year.

## B. State Update

John Morales reported:

- Submitted the five year plan- currently being reviewed by State officials.
- Integration in Yuma County is proceeding well; Grace Wehrle from DES will soon be relocating to YPIC's location as part of the Business Team.
- Christian Espinoza from DES continues to do an outstanding job collaborating with YPIC staff.

## C. Business Plan Update

- The Five Year Plan was submitted.
- We continue to work on the Cost Sharing Agreements to go along with the Memorandums of Understanding.
- DES will have two employees located at YPIC; the salaries and benefits of the two employees will be included on the Resource Sharing Agreement.
- Other partners share of resources such as rent and personnel will also be included on the Resource Sharing Agreements.

## D. Rapid Response/Business Outreach Update

 Patrick Goetz from YPIC, and Christian Espinoza from DES presented a power point that reported activities in the last month (power point is attached).

## E. Update on Strategic Partners Meeting

- As described in the Five Year Business Plan, the Partners meeting will be held two to three times a year.
- The next meeting is scheduled on February 19<sup>th</sup>, 2014 at 9:00a.m. at GYEDC's Boardroom- Thank you Julie Engel for hosting the event.
- The focus of the next meeting will be on Education.
- Presentations will include: Helios Project (Ready Now Yuma) with the Yuma Union High School District and the Joint Technical Educational District (JTED).

#### F. Sector Strategy Technical Assistance Award

- Awarded Sector Partnership Launch Assistance from the Arizona Commerce Authority.
- A meeting will take place in March to define a strategic approach. The areas of concentration will be Transportation and Logistics.
- YPIC and GYEDC will be present but taking the back seat and will let the partners speak and find solutions to some of their problems.
- John spoke of the great collaboration that takes place in Yuma County.

## VIII. Other information and/or Committee Reports Economic Development:

Julie Engel reported:

- Thanked Kevin Wilkins he attended a Trade Show in Washington DC and talked to a UAS company; the company recently signed a lease with Rolle Air Field.
- The Airport Authority met to discuss their role in this testing project, and decided to let airport staff make that decision.
- The airport staff decided act more in the role of "landlord" and allow AWC to be the responsible party for the COA (Certificate of Authorization).
- Julie thanked Dr. Mayle and Daniel Barajas for their outstanding support on this project.
- Kevin Wilkins spoke of the importance of having expert knowledge in the subject when talking to companies such as the UAS Company previously mentioned. We expect more success stories as a result of this first client.
- Dr. Mayle spoke of the importance of the Certificates of Authorization.
- Looking at two companies for food production- one from Australia, and one from the East Coast.
- Pat and Julie are working on an Advanced Manufacturing Grant (INCP); the deadline is March 14. If selected there will be a billion dollars available to invest on infrastructure and manufacturing. The grant is being funded by several sources.
- Nancy Ngai stated that they hired a consultant to assist in the writing of the grant.

### **Finance and Personnel Committee**

Sam Pepper reported:

- The committee met yesterday at 3 p.m.
- The committee reviewed the following:
   YPIC's financial reports for the last six months
   First six months of budget for the MLK Center
   Income Tax Return
- Sam Pepper commended the staff from the MLK for effectively marketing the multi-purpose room. The revenues are exceeding the

- revenue budget.
- Savings include \$5,000 rent savings per month by leaving the CDC, and moving Youth Services to the MLK.
- Sam mentioned that this is "turning out to be a good business model".

### **Charter High School:**

Ken Rosevear reported:

- The EOC Charter High School Board met previous to this meeting.
- Enrollment is at 105; Attendance is at 89% due to illness.
- 19 to 20 students are expected to graduate
- There is a new criteria for Alternative School Status and a new mission statement need to be developed as part of the new conditions by the school board
- The staff will work on two statements and the Board will review them at their next meeting on March 12, 2014.

### **Youth Council:**

Pat Romant reported:

- AWC is currently recruiting 15 more out of school youth.
- 11 students obtained their GED Certificate December, 2013.
- AWC purchased the PLATO program to assist student with the new GED curriculum.
- The new GED curriculum is very difficult as well as the test. It required for students to spend a lot of time studying for each subject.
- Adriana McBride conducted the Youth Council meeting for Patricia Romant.

#### IX. Good of the Order

Ken Rosevear gave an update on the water issue as it affects Yuma County and the rest of the State of Arizona.

Pat Romant informed the Board member of the new changes taking place at YPIC.

Alicia Huizar is the new Executive Assistant/Contract Manager Adriana McBride is the new Human Resource Manager Barbara Steven will be retiring in May 2014.


