Mr. Clark recommended the committee review data with a broad perspective today and for future meetings focus on more specific industries.

The following Committee questions and comments were discussed.

Question/Comment	Response
Mr. Clark reviewed the previous board recommendations from last year to unofficially create a top tier of In Demand Industries that included Health Care, Construction, and Manufacturing.	-Ms. Veidmark is in agreement with selections from last year. Construction, Healthcare, Transportation, and Manufacturing should be of high focus this yearMs. Stiak reviewed finance and insurance as one of the fastest-growing sectors in the West and East Valleys -Mr. Willenborg agreed with Ms. Veidmark's comments regarding Transportation and Warehousing as important components.
Mr. Clark queried the committee to add or subtract any industries from the list	-Chair Robichaud confirmed the 6 <sup>th</sup> item not shown is IT.
Chair Robichaud asked if the committee would like to add additional industries for discussion	-Ms. Tashbook will acquire custom analysis to break down wholesale trade and professional technical industries.
Mr. Baldenegro questioned how contact centers were captured within this segment of the population	-Ms. Tashbook categorized the call centers that fall under the support of an industry, they will be grouped within that industry. If they are independent, they would be grouped under the information industry.
Mr. Clark summarized the conversation to keep (in no specific order) Manufacturing, Construction, Healthcare, Transportation, Warehousing, Finance, Insurance, and IT. Review additional information on professional technical and wholesale trade to review in the future.	-Chair Robichaud would like to include wholesale trade

Chair Robichaud thanked the group for the presentation and discussion.

Chair Robichaud opened to the committee members to share success stories and/or bring future guests to the committee for presentations.

Ms. Stiak suggested the guest Brian Darby, President of Infrastructure Masons (I Masons), the National Organization of Data Centers.

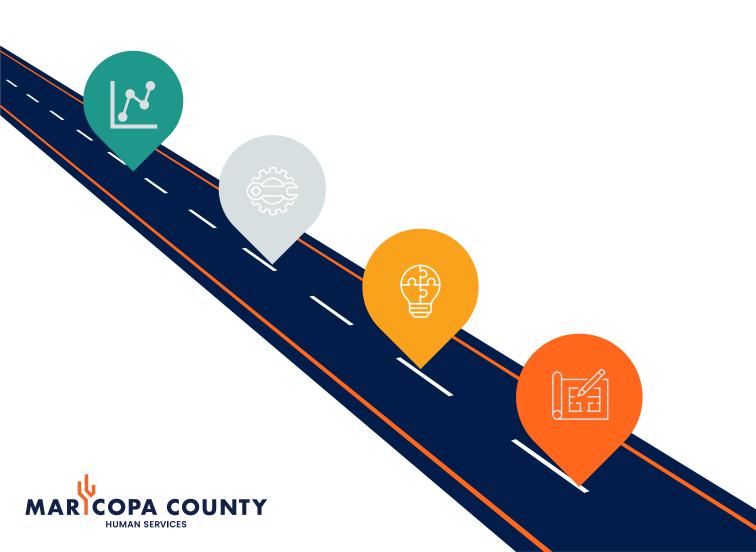

### Importance of In-Demand Industries

- Set the direction for Service Delivery and Program Implementation
- Expectation of Maricopa County Board of Supervisor's
- Prioritization of Funding
- Local, Regional, and Statewide Impact



### **Setting the Direction**



#### Data Informed Decision Making

We're not just spinning the globe and pointing. Using current and forecasted data will allow us to stay ahead of the demand and be in the best position possible to meet it.

#### Maricopa County Industry Needs

Maricopa County is growing rapidly in both economic opportunities and population. We're needed more than ever to bridge the gap in an intentional manner.

#### Meaningful and Secure Opportunities

Miscalculations and unforeseen changes to industry have real life consequences for our participants.

#### Framework for Innovation

We will also strive to be innovative to ensure our services are as impactful as possible, the industries determined by the board play a direct role in our strategic planning and pursuit of additional funding.

#### **Reduced Budget**

Costs of training programs have continued to increase, so the dollar doesn't go as far as it used to.

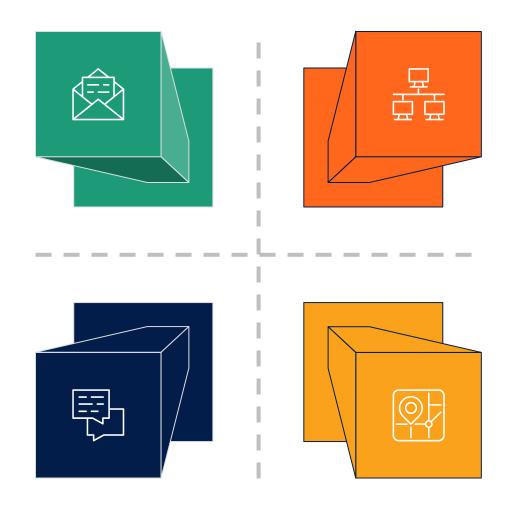
#### **Standardization of Funding**

### What does "In-Demand mean?

### In-Demand Industry

An <u>industry</u> sector that has a <u>substantial current or potential impact</u> (including through jobs that lead to economic self-sufficiency and opportunities for advancement) on the state, regional, or local economy, as appropriate, <u>and</u> that <u>contributes to the growth or stability</u> of other supporting businesses, or the growth of other industry sectors;

### In-Demand Occupation

An <u>occupation</u> that currently <u>has or is projected to have a number of positions</u> (including positions that lead to economic self-sufficiency and opportunities for advancement) in an industry sector so as to have a <u>significant impact</u> on the state, regional, or local economy, as appropriate.



## Who Selects In-Demand Industries & Occupations?

Per WIOA § 3(23)(B):

"The determination of whether an industry sector or occupation is in-demand under this paragraph shall be made by the State board or <u>local board</u>, as appropriate, using State and regional business and labor market projections, including the use of labor market information."





## Part II: In-Demand Occupations

### What is an "In-Demand Occupation?

#### **WIOA Definition:**

- Large number of available positions or projected to have a large number of positions
- Lead to economic self-sufficiency (e.g., high wages)
- Opportunities for advancement (e.g., career pathways)
- Critical industries



## In-Demand Occupation vs. Target Occupation

### In-demand Occupation

- Demand in the Region
- Considered most critical to the region's economy
- Linked to selected industry sectors
- Used to educate job seekers regarding quality occupations in the region



## In-Demand Occupation vs. Target Occupation

### **Target Occupation**

- Subset of in-demand occupations <u>for which training funding will be</u> <u>provided</u>
- Training or education component related to occupation
  - Industry recognized credential/certificate
- Meets additional selection criteria set forth by the Board (e.g., wage threshold, # openings threshold, growth rate threshold)

### Current In-Demand Occupations

- Construction, n = 13
- Finance and Insurance, n = 15
- Healthcare and Social Assistance, n = 21
- Information, n = 11
- Manufacturing, n = 10
- Transportation and Warehousing, n = 6

**Total: 77 Occupations** 



### Considerations When Making Selections

- Labor Market Data (Office of Economic Opportunity (OEO) Recommendations)
  - Occupational data analysis
- Local knowledge/wisdom
  - Board & Committee members
  - Service providers

\*Local Boards should evaluate selections regularly (annually) to ensure alignment with existing market conditions.



## In-Demand Occupations & Workforce Services Provided to Job Seekers

- Customers seeking employment in an identified <u>in-demand occupation</u> may also, upon meeting WIOA qualifications, be eligible to receive funding for <u>Occupational</u> <u>Skills Training</u> that results in a nationally-recognized certification that ultimately leads to employment in the occupation.
- All customers seeking job-search assistance receive workforce services (as needed), including:
  - o Skills Assessments
  - o Job search workshops
  - o Resume assistance
  - o Interview preparation assistance
  - o Referrals to employers
  - o Supportive Services (e.g., transportation assistance, housing/utility support, childcare assistance)





# OEO in-demand Occupations Recommendation and Selection Process

## OEO Methodology for Rating In-Demand Occupations

- 5-Star Rating Model
  - Ratings highlight top occupations by education level
- Variables Considered
  - Average Annual Wages
  - Employment Levels
  - Projected Numeric & Percent Growth
  - Projected Openings
- Philosophy: All job seekers should be able to get support with connecting to the best job opportunities at their current education and know what the best opportunities at the next education level.



## Considerations for In-Demand Occupations

- Does the board want to use Maricopa (Total) or Maricopa (minus Phoenix) analysis?
- Does the board want to offer a broad or targeted list of In-Demand Occupations?
