VII. EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY CENTER CHARTER HIGH SCHOOL BOARD REPORT

Michael J. Sabath reported the following information:

- Enrollment is at 82 students
- Principal Grossenburg presented the Emergency Operation Plan for the high school
 - The plan ensures the safety and continuity of operations during emergencies
 - It was developed in consultation with the Yuma Police Department and

- Yuma Fire Department
 - The plan will be presented to the school Board and Workforce Development Board for approval
- As of the current reporting period, expenses total \$170,715, representing 16% of the annual at 17% of the school year

VIII. DIRECTORS REPORT

Nidia Herrera presented a PowerPoint. PowerPoint is attached.

Judith Castro asked a question regarding youth performance goals/outcomes, in the past the program was not accepting new applicants for youth services. Is the program now taking new referrals and serving new clients? Nidia Herrera replied yes. Ms. Castro asked if clients from the waiting list were contacted. Ms. Herrera replied, staff should go back through the waiting list and reach out to those individuals, Ms. Herrera stated she will confirm to make sure the process is followed.

IX. PRESENTATIONS AND INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:

1. Business Services/Rapid Response

April Romero, Business Services Coordinator presented a PowerPoint. PowerPoint is attached.

A conversation took place regarding the manufacturing company, highlights of the conversation are as follows;

- Engineered Products of Manufacturing held a large hiring event in San Luis
- Over 600 applicants attended; many attendees were from San Luis area, including individuals with manufacturing experience and certifications from Mexico
- Company had been recruiting for 8 months without success until this event
- Initial hires needed: machine operators (sheet cutting/punching), followed by welders and assembly line workers, some applicants already had welding experience
- Future plan is to open a paint/detailing section
- The company will also provide training from their home facility for specific processes

Judith Castro asked if someone would have to be enrolled in ARIZONA@WORK to apply? April Romero replied no, they do not have to be enrolled in the program. The company is only accepting paper applications, applications can be provided via email. The employer requested that all applications must be submitted to the ARIZONA@WORK team at dromero@ypic.com or cquiroga@ypic.com.

2. Financials as of July 31, 2025

Steve Barba, Finance & Accounting Manager presented the financials as of July 31, 2025. Budget expenses for the month of July are at 6%. PY24/FY25 is at 57%. Have not started to spend PY25/FY26 funds.

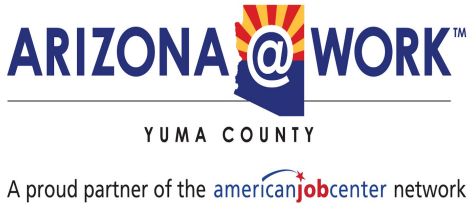
