IV. *CALL TO THE PUBLIC

There were no comments from the public.

Samuel G. Loveless acknowledged Lynne Pancrazi and Ian McGaughey from the Yuma County Board of Supervisors.

V. APPROVAL OF THE CONSENT AGENDA

Samuel G. Loveless asked for a motion to approve the consent agenda. Maria Chavoya made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda; Seconded by Carla F. Gonzalez.

The motion carried 13-0

Board members; Gregory LaVann and Frank Grijalva joined the meeting.

VI. DISCUSSION AND/OR ACTION ITEMS

1. Approval of the Revised Youth Incentive Payment Policy

Nidia Herrera recommended the approval from the Workforce Development Board for the revised Youth Incentive Payment Policy to include a \$250 incentive for participants who earn an associate's or bachelor's degree. Upon completion, participants may submit documentation to receive the incentive. The incentive supports credential attainment and contributes to credential performance outcomes while recognizing participants' academic achievements.

Maria Chavoya asked if incentives are currently available or is it a new addition. Nidia Herrera replied, incentives are currently provided for participants who earn a high school equivalency and occupational licenses such as commercial truck driving or Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) credentials, with eligible participants receiving a \$250 incentive. It was noted that a participant recently earned a degree, prompting the need to expand the policy to ensure degree attainment is also recognized. As a result, the proposed revision includes incentives for participants earning associate's degrees, bachelor's degrees, and other advanced certifications or degrees.

Carla F. Gonzalez asked for an approximate amount. Nidia Herrera replied she was made aware of one individual who obtained a degree and emphasized the importance of providing the incentive in recognition of the individual's commitment and achievement.

Samuel G. Loveless asked for a motion to approve the Revised Youth Incentive Payment Policy.

Maria Chavoya made a motion to approve the Revised Youth Incentive Payment Policy; Seconded by Carla F. Gonzalez. The motion was approved unanimously.

The motion carried 15-0

2. Performance Review Committee Removal and Additions

- **Remove: Wallin Gustin and Gregory LaVann**
- **Add: Karime Hayer and Carla Gonzalez**

Nidia Herrera recommended the Workforce Development Board the approval to remove Wallin Gustin and Gregory LaVann from the Performance Review Committee. Mr. Gustin has been reassigned to another local area and is no longer serving on the Board and Mr. LaVann has indicated he is unable to commit to serving on the Performance Review Committee. Nidia Herrera also recommended the addition of Karime Hayer and Carla Gonzalez to the Performance Review Committee.

Samuel G. Loveless asked for a motion to approve the Performance Review Committee Removal and Additions.

Daniel Corr made a motion to approve the Performance Review Committee Removal and Additions; Seconded by Frank Grijalva. The motion was approved unanimously.

The motion carried 15-0

VII. EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY CENTER CHARTER HIGH SCHOOL BOARD REPORT

Michael J. Sabath reported the following information:

- Enrollment is at 80
- Expenses are at 79%, at 82% of the school year
- A report was provided in which students participated on service learning and experiential learning activities
 - Students visited businesses and organizations and engaged in a variety of activities, including serving meals at Crossroads Mission, touring a dental practice and visiting a hematology laboratory
 - Additional site visits included Fourth Avenue Gym and a field trip to the Tumco Mine
 - The report highlighted the school's continued focus on strengthening career readiness opportunities for students
 - These experiences were noted as valuable in supporting student learning and enhancing their overall high school experience
- The graduation ceremony is scheduled for May 21, 2026 at 6:00 p.m. at the Yuma Historic Theater

VIII. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

Gregory LaVann reported the following information:

- Kimberly-Clark has officially announced its presence in Yuma County
 - The company, a global manufacturer plans to develop a \$100 million demonstration facility that is expected to employ approximately 54 individuals to start, with an average salary of \$85,000
 - The project represents a capital investment of approximately \$100 million
 - The initial phase will focus on validating production and scaling capabilities for a new product developed through long-term research and development efforts in Yuma County
 - If successful, a second phase is anticipated to include a large-scale paper processing facility of approximately one million square feet, with a projected capital investment exceeding \$1 billion
 - ARIZONA@WORK is working with Kimberly-Clark on recruitment, hiring, and related coordination efforts
- An update was provided on a new economic development project involving Tetrix Manufacturing, a company specializing in modular housing construction
 - The company is currently under contract to purchase a facility in Yuma County
 - Initial operations are expected to begin with approximately 50 employees, with plans to expand to approximately 150 employees at full build-out of Phase 1
 - The company manufactures modular housing units that are completed off-site and assembled into multifamily housing developments, these units are designed to reduce construction costs and shorten permitting timelines compared to traditional construction methods
 - Tetrix Manufacturing is based in Scottsdale and has expressed strong interest in expanding operations in Yuma County, noting positive engagement with local partners, including ARIZONA@WORK
- FedEx will construct a distribution facility in Yuma County
 - The facility will be approximately 200,000 square feet and is expected to employ 100 to 150 individuals, depending on seasonal demand
 - The distribution center will serve the Southwest region, including California and surrounding areas, as a regional backup facility
 - The project is scheduled to be operational in January 2028
- A medical device company currently operating in Yuma County is in negotiations to acquire land in the City of Yuma for the development of a \$35 million manufacturing facility
 - The company is expected to create approximately 400 jobs associated with the project
 - The company is based on the East Coast and has an established presence in both Yuma and Mexico
 - Due to increasing operational costs, including tariffs, labor challenges, and turnover in Mexico, the company is evaluating the relocation of a portion of its operations to the United States
 - The project is currently in the design and planning phase with support

- from a broker and developer; however, final commitments have not yet been executed
- Staff will continue to monitor and provide updates on the project as it progresses

IX. DIRECTORS REPORT

Nidia Herrera presented a PowerPoint. PowerPoint is attached.

X. PRESENTATIONS AND INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:

1. Board Member Resignation

Samuel G. Loveless acknowledged the resignation and retirement of Dr. Corr following nearly 10 years of dedicated service. Mr. Loveless expressed appreciation for his longstanding partnership with ARIZONA@WORK and his contributions as a counselor, advisor and valued board member. Board members recognized his commitment, leadership, and support throughout his tenure and extended sincere gratitude for his years of service.

Chairman Samuel G. Loveless left the meeting; Secretary/Treasurer Antonio Zuniga continued the meeting.

2. Business Services/Rapid Response Report

April Romero, Business Services Coordinator presented a PowerPoint. PowerPoint is attached.

Frank Grijalva asked if the call center who is laying off a large number of employees stated why they are closing. April Romero replied the company stated it is a permanent closure and did not specify why. Staff reported experiencing difficulties in securing opportunities to present and explain available services, which required multiple outreach attempts before communication was established.

3. Financials as of March 31, 2026

Steve Barba, Finance & Accounting Manager presented the financial highlights as of March 31, 2026.

- Budget for fiscal year 2025-2026 expenses are at 57% for Adult, 63% for Dislocated Worker, 70% for Youth, 74% for Admin., 61% for Rapid Response and 64% overall
- PY24/FY25 WIOA contract is 100% spent
- The new contract for PY25/FY26 is spent at 30%

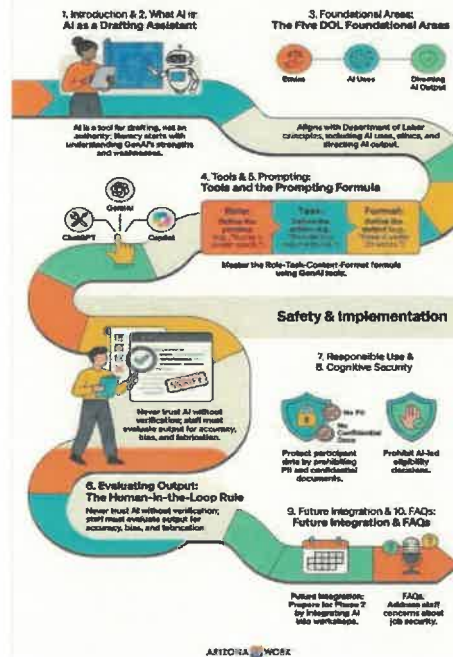

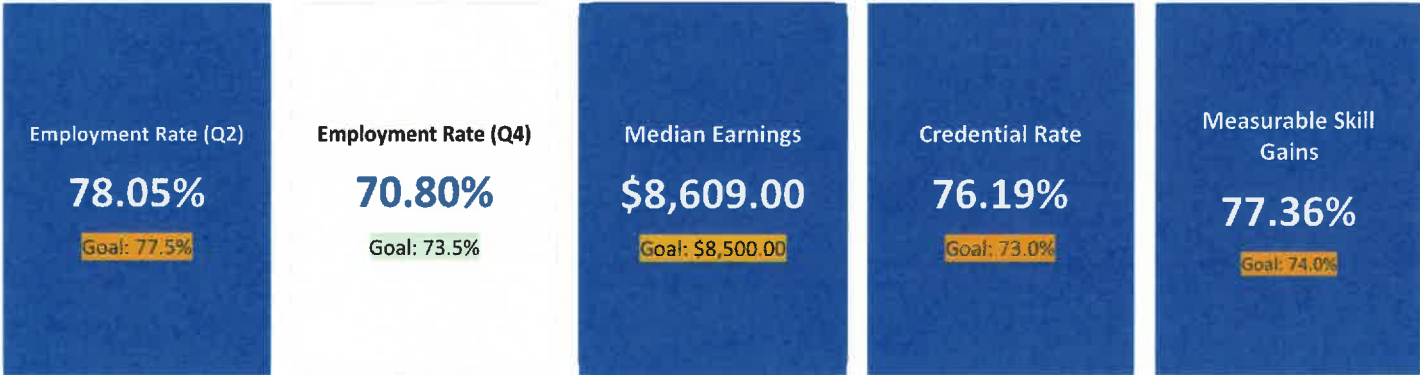
