Because of his passion for transportation he was recognized as one the Leaders of the Year in Public Policy by the Arizona Capitol Times in 2012.

In 2015, David was appointed to the City of Phoenix’s Citizens Transportation Commission by Mayor Greg Stanton which will oversee the expenditures of Proposition 104. This year Governor Ducey appointed him to the Workforce Arizona Council. He currently serves as chairman of the Transportation Business Partners, a statewide coalition of business interests advocating for a statewide transportation investment solution and is a charter member of the Interstate 11 Coalition.

In the past, he was appointed to serve on the Governor’s Air Quality Strategies Task Force under Governor Symington and Governor Hull where he chaired the Particulate Matter Subcommittee. He was appointed by Governor Napolitano to the Governor’s Council on Workforce Policy, the P-20 Council and Chairman of the Citizens Transportation Oversight Committee. He served on the Maricopa Association of Governments Air Quality Technical Advisory Committee and Maricopa County’s Regional Transportation District Guidance Committee.
